

FOURTH PEPPOL MULTISTAKEHOLDERFORUM

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Abstract: The PEPPOL-Project (Pan-European Public eProcurement On-Line) is a large Scale Pilot within the Competitiveness and Innovation Programme (CIP) of the European Commission. The objective of the PEPPOL project is to set up a pan-European pilot solution that, conjointly with existing national solutions facilitates EU-wide interoperable public eProcurement. The vision of the PEPPOL project is that any company and in particular SMEs in the EU can communicate electronically with any European governmental institution for the entire procurement process. The final outcome of PEPPOL will be an interoperational environment build upon national systems and infrastructures supporting the full cycle of eProcurement activities.

1. Description of Workshop

The Multistakeholderforum aims to include the persons and interest groups which are affected by the PEPPOL.AT initiative in the project at an early stage. The Multistakeholderforum facilitates a so called “offline participation” in the project. It is a regular meeting of stakeholders and representatives of the involved stakeholders. The purpose of this event is the presentation of the status quo with the following exchange of opinions, wishes, recommendations and criticism. The results of the forum are documented and the received feedback is included in the project. Through the involvement of stakeholders transparency and acceptance of the users should in return win the acceptance of the users and also assure the use of the PEPPOL applications.

The first part of the workshop will be held in English language and addresses the international stakeholders of the PEPPOL project. It starts with an introduction of the national PEPPOL top management presenting the results of the last Multistakeholderforum. The PEPPOL project director André Hoddevik will make a statement about “PEPPOL: Vision and Implementation“. After this, presentations about the international enlargement of the PEPPOL consortium and PEPPOL components in relation to other e-Government areas and egosta (e-Government stakeholder involvement) will follow. Furthermore first results of the master thesis with the title “Borderless E-Procurement: Determinants for Local Diffusion” are presented. After a short break sessions in German language which address the national stakeholders will follow. The session “pre-awarding-phase” will start with presentations about the Virtual Company Dossier (VCD) and eCatalogue. In the afternoon the session “post-awarding-phase” takes place where the work packages eOrdering, eInvoice and Infrastructure will be presented.
