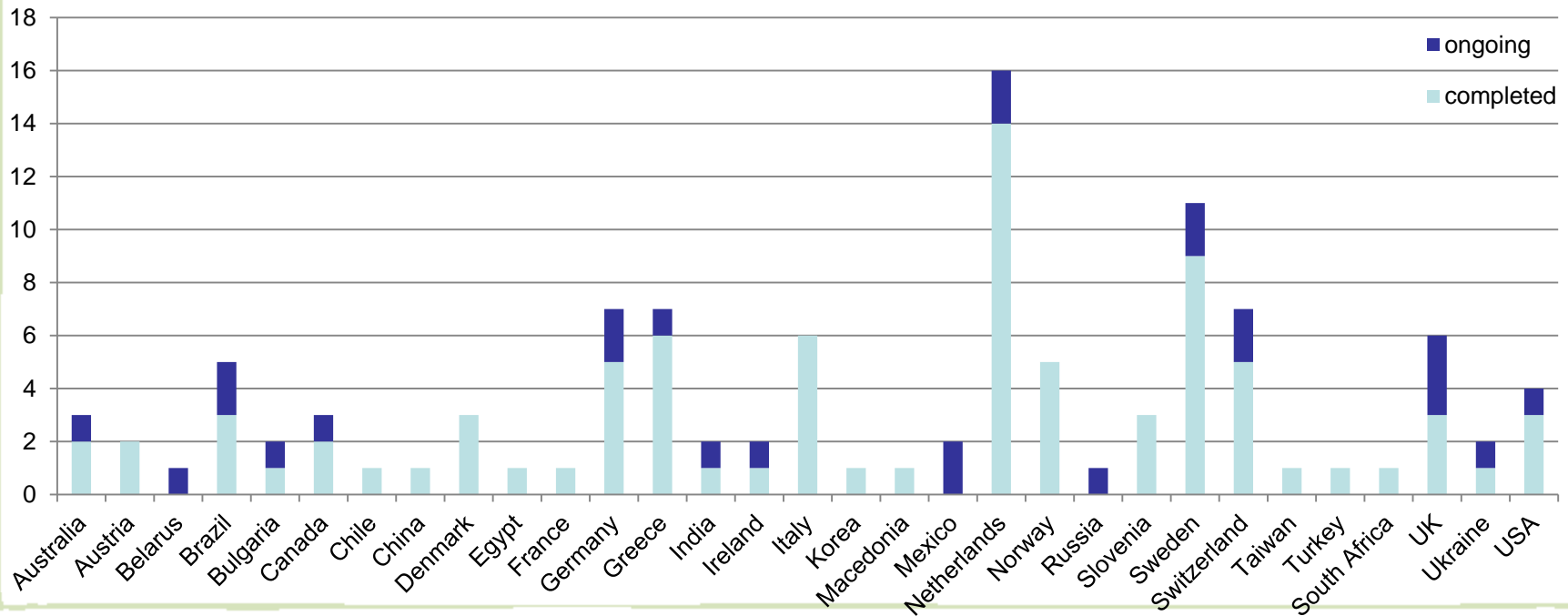

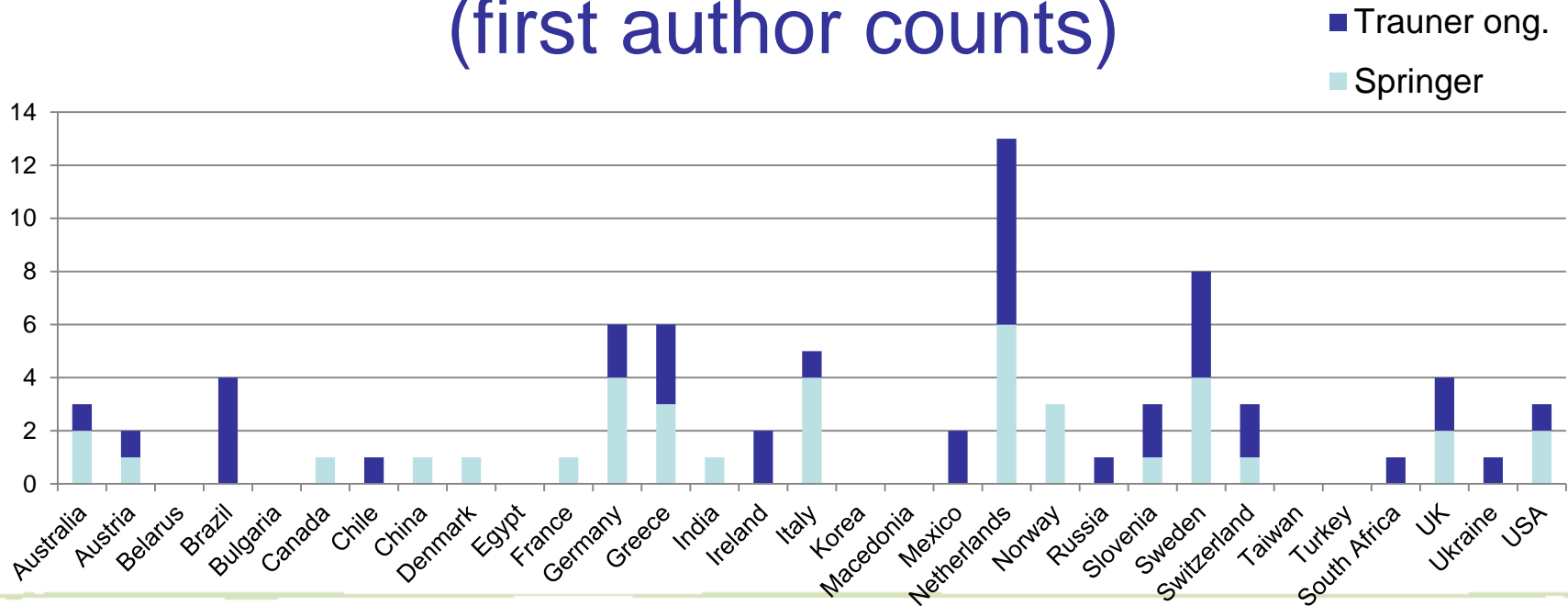
Facts on EGOV 2011 author origins of submissions by country (first author counts)
